#### Be on Twitter

OK, so this isn't technically a blogging tip per se, but it's one of the best ways to connect with other bloggers and grow your blog. The quality of your followers is more important than quantity. Remember, you're trying to build up important relationships that can benefit both parties involved. Be generous with your retweets and others will be generous with theirs.
